

## Confusion Over ColdFusion MX 6.1 Editions

### Question

OK I'm confused now. (not hard to do apparently) Are you saying with the purchase of CFMX Enterprise 6.1 I can now have a full install of JRun (with its own admin) \*and\* deploy n instances of CFMX on that? Without having to purchase JRun separately?  
How does one arrange the licensing in the initial JRun install?

### Response

Yep, that is exactly what I am saying. Nothing to arrange, if you have CF MX 6.1 Enterprise then you have the JRun license. When you run the installer you'll be presented with three installation options:

- 1) Install the old way, one CF instance with an embedded JRun.
- 2) Install a full JRun 4 with one instance of CF pre installed (and you can add more too).
- 3) Create the Java archive for deployment on a J2EE server of your choice, including JRun (and the just installed JRun if you used option 2 previously).

So, you are getting:

- CF Enterprise
- What was CF/J2EE
- JRun

Add the cost of those bits up and the price of Enterprise starts to look very good indeed.
